



From the numerous constumes the judges decided that Nina Smith and Doris Watlington were the cutest. They were dressed as twin beasant maids. The usual Halloween theme was carried out.

Under the green and yellow streamers of the May Pole centering the recreation room of the Club House the couples of B.Y.H.S. enjoyed dancing and games. The Home Economics girls sponsered the big event on May 11, 1946 under the direction of Miss Jessie Mary Wilson. A minature fole centered the punch table from which delicious represents were served.

On October 25, 1945 the Juniors entertained the Seniors, and a number of invited guests at the Club House. Dancing in the candle light was enjoyed by all. Later fuzz punch and cookies were served from the refreshment table which was decorated with candles and evergreens.






JUNIOR CLASS HISTORY






